Funding will be used to implement the model, establish and pilot the new programs incrementally and develop a framework, guidelines and processes to ensure sustainability of these programs. The Comorbidity Worker will also upskill staff in recognising and supporting clients with complex and comorbidity issues including providing external briefing sessions to professionals.
